Siem Reap (Angkor), Kampong Thom – Phnom Penh – Kampong Chhnang – Oudong – Kratie – Ratanakiri – Phnom Penh – Koh Kong – Sihanoukville

#### Description

This is an exciting journey through one of few regions of Asia having preserved its traditional character. The journey leads through 10 provinces of Cambodia as well as to Phnom Penh and Sihanoukville. The Angkor – the largest archaeological site of the world – is certainly the main highlight. The magic remains of different capitals of the Khmer Empire (between 9th and 15th century) embedded into vast forest areas rest upon an overall territory of over 400 sq. km. Among them are the famous temples Angkor Wat and Bayon with their countless bas-reliefs and sculptures.

No doubt, Cambodia is far more than just Angkor. About 80 per cent of Cambodian population live in rural areas, where life has barely changed since Angkor. In this aspect Cambodia differs from many other countries in South-East Asia where nearly the half of the population abandoned its traditional way of life and lives in huge cities – often in poverty, without work or proper housing. Everywhere you go in Cambodia – you'll always be greeted with a friendly, traditional Asian smile.

What is scarcely known about Cambodia is the fact that its beaches belong to the most wonderful in Asia –ideal for individual vacationers and families on holiday.

2 Siem Reap - Angkor

*Morning.* Excursion to Banteay Srei temple (967 AD). On return visit Banteay Samre (Suryavarman II, 1113-1150), Eastern Mebon, Pre Rup and Prasat Kravan (10th century).

*Afternoon*: Afternoon: Visit Ta Prohm (Jayavarman VII) and Angkor Wat (Suryavarman II, 1113-1150). View sunset from mountain temple Phnom Bakhaeng (900 AD) with a spectacular view in the main Angkor temple area, the artificial Western Baray (2 x 4 km) and the Great lake Tonle Sap.

3 Siem Reap - Angkor

*Morning*. Visit of Angkor Thom: - Southern Gate, Bayon, Terrace of Elephants, Terrace of Leper King, the 12 Prasat Suor Prat (King Jayavarman VII, 1181-1220);

- Temples of 11th century: Ba Phuon,

Phimeanakas, Northern and Southern Khleang.

*Afternoon*: visit other temples of Jayavarman VII: Preah Khan, Neak Poan, Ta Prohm. Evening: View performance of traditional dances at Apsara Theatre with Khmer set menu dinner.

#### 4 Siem Reap - Angkor

Full day excursion to remote temples Koh Ker (Angkor capital 921-944) and Boeng Mealea (Suryavarman II, 1131-1150).

#### 5 Siem Reap - Tonle Sap Lake

*Morning.* Boat cruise on Tonle Sap. Visit floating village.

*Afternoon*: Visit traditional handicraft workshops (wood and stone carving, lacquer work) of Artisans d'Angkor and show rooms.

## 6 Siem Reap – Kampong Thom – Kampong Cham

*Morning.* Drive to Sambor Prei Kuk (7th-8th centuries). Continue to Kampong Thom and Kampong Cham with stopover at Phnom Santuk pagoda, Phnom Srei pagoda, Phnom Pros

pagoda and Nokor Wat temple (11th century) & Wat Nokor monastery. Accommodation in Kampong Cham City.













#### 7 Kampong Cham – Kratie

*Morning*. Drive to Kratie (3-4 hours). On the way passing through rubber plantations.

*Afternoon.* Visit Roka Kandal pagoda, Phnom Sambok pagoda and viewing point (view over Mekong river). First visit to Kampi dolphin viewing point.

#### 8 Ratanakiri

*Morning.* Second visit to Kampi dolphin viewing point.

Drive to Ratanakiri (4-5 hours drive). Accommodation at Terres Rouges Lodge (dinner).

#### 9 Ratanakiri (full board)

Direction northwest today, we cross bamboo forests before reaching the village of Voeune Saï located on the left bank of the Sé San river ; the view on the Chinese village on the other side of the river is quite pretty. Besides, this place is nearly a Chinese enclave in Cambodian territory, most villagers, who are there the thirties, don't even speak Khmer. Upstream of the Se San is Kaoh Peak, Kachok village that practice funeral statuary, then departure for a trip through rubber plantations towards the nearby waterfalls Dinner & night at the Lodge.

#### 10 Ratanakiri (full board)

We're going full North today, heading towards Laos and the village of Taveng. We first cross Veyrum Plang, a round lava field in the forest; a few steps away there is a small waterfall (in the rainy season only) surrounded by tigers caves. Later on, we stop at some nice Kroeung villages located in the forest on both sides of the road. The more North we go, the more beautiful the forest. In some Kroeung villages, depending on the season, we might discover some quite impressive bachelor houses built on very high stilts. Let's notice that, when they have achieved their goal and when the young man has become head of a family, these houses are destroyed before being raised again by younger men the following season. Depending on the time and the state of the dirt road, we will choose a location for a picnic before exploring the nearby villages. We end up with a detour to Yaklaom lake, a beautiful and perfectly-round stretch of water, surrounded by forest, for a late afternoon swim.

11 Ratanakiri – Phnom Penh Drive to Phnom Penh (8-9 hours).

12 Phnom Penh *Morning*. Visit National Museum, Silver pagoda & Royal Palace.

#### Afternoon: At leisure.

#### 13 Phnom Penh

*Morning.* Visit Wat Phnom pagoda and local markets.

*Afternoon.* Visit Tuol Sleng genocide museum and mass graves near Choeung Ek commune ("killing fields").

*Evening.* Sunset cruise by boat on the Chatokmuk, crossing of Mekong River, Tonle Bassac River and Tonle Sap River.

## 14 Kampong Chhnang, Oudong – Phnom Penh

Full day excursion to traditional handicraft places of Cambodia in the provinces Kandal and Kampong Chhnang. Since about 7000 years Kampong Chhnang is home of currently 2000 potters, most of them women. You can see a traditional ceramic firing at open fire but also a ceramic centre, recently build within a German development project.

On the way you will visit Oudong, the ancient capital of the Kingdom of Cambodia over 200 years (17th-19th centuries). There is a spectacular viewing point on the top of capitol hill. Visit nearby silversmith village Kampong Luong. Return to Phnom Penh.

#### 15 Phnom Penh – Koh Kong

Drive to Tatai (Koh Kong province, 3-4 hours), continue by small boat to "4 rivers floating ecolodge" (20 minutes).

#### 16-18 Koh Kong

At leisure. Time for excursions to trips into different surrounding eco-systems (on request).

18 Koh Kong – Sihanoukville Drive to Sihanoukville.

#### 19-22 Sihanoukville

At leisure.

On day 20 full day excursion by boat to nearby islands (with lunch on board).

23 Sihanoukville – Phnom Penh Transfer to Phnom Penh airport. Departure.

Visit Ondoung Rossey village - a typical Khmer village with traditional paddy farmers and potters. Visit farming houses and small handicraft pottery workshops. Watch an ancient-style pottery firing.

Drive back towards Phnom Penh and stop at Oudong - Khmer capitol during 17th-19th centuries, situated on a hill near the Tonle Sap River. Enjoy the spectacular view on the surroundings.

Near Oudong visit the silversmith village of Kampong Luong. Return to Phnom Penh.

#### Excursions from Sihanoukville:

Tour 1 Boat trip to Koh Rong and Samloem islands

Transfer from hotel (Sihanoukville) to boat pier. Around 10h00 departure. After 1 hour stopover at Koh Thach island for snorkeling. Continue to blue lagoon of Koh Sanlem, stay for 2-3 hours for swimming and excursion into a mangrove forest. Return to Sihanoukville, arrival at about 16h00. On board: coffee, tea, cake, big buffet for lunch, fresh fruits and fishing & snorkeling equipment for all activities.

Tour 2 Kbal Chay Waterfall (Sihanoukville) Drive from hotel 15 km to Kbal chay. Lunch picnic at waterfall. Return to hotel

Tour 4 Kampot City, Caves and Beach Drive from hotel (Sihanoukville) to Kampot City (105 km, 1.5 hours). Stopover at pepper plantation. Seafood lunch in Kampot City. Relax at beach. Visit caves near Kampot. Return to Sihanoukville (overnight in standard or deluxe hotel possible).

#### Tour 5 Kep City and Beach

Drive from hotel (Sihanoukville) to Kep City (140 km, 2.5-3 hours). Stopover at pepper plantation. Seafood lunch in Kep City. Relax at beach. Return to Sihanoukville (overnight in standard hotel or lodge possible).

#### 1 Banlung

Day

Arriving at Banlung, the capital of Ratanakiri, nicknamed the "Red City" because of the omnipresent laterite. Dinner & night at Terres Rouges Lodge (superb house built of precious wood, located by a lake, in the middle of a wonderful garden).









3 The Kroeung territory, waterfalls & elephant ride

Drive through rubber plantations towards the nearby waterfalls and elephant ride before heading towards Laos and the village of Taveng. Cross Veyrum Plang, a round lava field in the forest; a few steps away there is a small waterfall (in the rainy season only) surrounded by tigers caves. Later on, stop at some nice Kroeung villages located in the forest on both sides of the road. The more North we go, the more beautiful the forest. In some Kroeung villages, depending on the season, we might discover some quite impressive bachelor houses built on very high stilts. Picnic before exploring the nearby villages. Night at Terres Rouges Lodge (full board).

4 The Zircon mines of the Three-Districts Driving through huge rubber trees forests planted by the French in 1961 and then the Tampoun jungle, until reaching the Three-Districts mining area, kind of tropical slum or favella populated by 3000 people lost in the middle of transformed this place into a massive Swiss cheese drilled with hundreds of 60cm-wide 12m-deep wells. Two kilometers away, there is the seventiered waterfall, called that way because the river is interrupted by seven rocky floors, creating waterfalls for taking shower and swimming. Night at Terres Rouges Lodge (full board).

#### 5 Ratanakiri and out...

Shopping tour in Banlung market. Departure.

Heading by to Putang Bunong village, elephant ride to O Ranna waterfall, swimming. Lunch box at waterfall, Then back to the village by elephant.

4 Sen Monorom - Phnom Penh Return to Phnom Penh by road.

## Banteay Meanchey province 3 days

#### Highlights:

\* Banteay Chhmar temple complex (12th century) and Homestay in a Khmer village

#### Day

1 Around noon: arrival at Banteay Chhmar (travelling from Siem Reap about 150 km, 3-4 hours). Lunch prepared by a local women's group under a straw hut and settling into your homestay.

Afternoon: Visit Banteay Chhmar Temple and Ta Prohm Temple. Ox-cart tour through the village and stop at the Silk Center.

Dinner at Ta Prohm temple (mats will be provided and traditional wooden torches lit for a welcome dinner under the stars, listen to traditional musicians). Overnight in your homestay.

2 Morning: Walk through Banteay Chhmar local market. Ox-cart tour to discover the Banteay Chhmar way of life (visit rice fields, stop at a farm). Continue to the Pol Pot Baray by kuyon. 12h00 Picnic on a wooden platform at the baray, prepared by the community based tourism restaurant and possibility to take a nap in a hammock. On the way back, visit to beekeeping and cassava farms. Enjoy the end of the day with your family and have dinner delivered by the community based tourism restaurant. Watch a rice flattening show and tasting afterwards.

3 Morning: Departure by kuyon (or your own vehicle) to visit Banteay Torp Temple. Lunch picnic prepared and delivered to Banteay Torp. Departure to Siem Reap (or Battambang or Poipet...).

## Birdwatching

#### ANG TRAPAENG THMOR

Sarus Crane Reserve (Sarus Crane, Comb Duck)

Aside from being a staging ground for more than 300 Sarus Crane in the dry (non-breeding) season, more than 200 species of other birds occur here, of which 18 have been classified as globally or near globally threatened. This is also one of the handful of sites in Cambodia where the endangered Eld's Deer can be seen.

The best time to see the Sarus Crane is from February January to May though an abundance of bird species can be viewed all year. Bengal Florican Reserve, Florican Grasslands (Bengal Florican, Manchurian reed Warbler) Designated Integrated Farming and Biodiversity Areas Bengal Florican Conservation Areas, the seasonally flooded grasslands of Kampong Thom and Siem Reap harbor the largest known population of Bengal Florican in Cambodia (and likely the world). There are several sites we visit that comprise important non-breeding grounds for many large water birds, such as the Greater Adjutant, Painted Stork, and Sarus Crane. Also found in this area is potentially the largest single concentration of over wintering Manchurian Reed Warblers.

#### TONLE SAP GREAT LAKE

#### Prek Toal Core Bird Reserve

(Indian Cormorant, Spot billed Pelicans, Greater Adjutant, many others)

The sanctuary harbours seven species of water birds of global significance: Spot billed Pelican, Milky Stork, Painted Stork, Lesser Adjutant, Greater Adjutant, Black headed Ibis and Oriental Darter. Prek Toal is unmatched throughout South East Asia for the number and populations of endangered water birds it supports through the dry season. Large flocks of cormorants, storks and pelicans are almost guaranteed from January to May, along with herons, egrets and terns and internationally significant population of Greyheaded Fish Eagles. An SVC group spotted a Masked Finfoot in February 2011.

#### TMATBOEY IBIS SITE

(Giant Ibis, White shouldered Ibis, Dry Deciduous Dipteropcarp Forest)

In 2007 Tmatboey Village won the WildAsia Responsible Tourism Award for the conservation project that has seen a dramatic rise in the population of White-shouldered Ibis and continued breeding success of the Giant Ibis. Tmatboey lies at the heart of the Kulen Promtep Wildlife Sanctuary the largest contiguous block of dry dipteropcarp forest left in South East Asia.

Aside from the ibis Woolly-necked Stork are relatively common and can be seen in flocks of over 40. Greater-spotted Eagle regularly over-winter and Grey-headed Fish Eagle and White-rumped Falcon occur at low densities. The Pale-capped Pigeon is another highlight along with an amazing diversity of woodpeckers and Brown Fish Owl, Spotted Wood Owl and Brown Wood Owl. In February 2010 night walks spotted Collared and Oriental Scops Owl, a mystery Aquila Eagle was seen on the same trip. A typical trip to Tmatboey takes 4 days and 3 nights. The best time to see the White-shouldered Ibis is January to March, and the Giant Ibis from January to April.

#### CHHEP VULTURE RESTAURANT

#### (Red headed Vulture)

Cambodia is of global importance for the conservation of Asian vultures (White-rumped Vulture , Slender-billed Vulture and Red-headed Vulture). These same species have recently undergone dramatic declines of >97% in the Indian subcontinent leading to possible extinction.

WCS maintains feeding stations or vulture restaurants in the area as a means of supporting the vulture population and conducting research. The restaurants also attract mammals, such as Jackals, Dhole and Leopards, and other birds including Greater Adjutant.

The restaurants are timed to coincide with SVC trips so visitors are nearly guaranteed the spectacle of up to 70 critically endangered vultures feeding on the carcass.

Chhep is only accessible during the Cambodian dry season, from December through to May.

#### OKOKI WHITE WINGED DUCK

Okoki an hour and a half from Chhep offers pristine open forest landscape and a riparian corridor of mixed evergreen forest along a water course with opportunities for viewing the White-winged Duck as well as the forest species of birds and passing migrants seen at the other sites in Preah Vihear. Typically at least 1 night is spent at Okoki and Chhepeach and preferably 2, allowing visitors to experience sunrise and sunset. At both Chhep and Okoki temporary but comfortable 'safari style' tented accommodation and washing facilities are organised, a cook travels with the group.

SVC works with local guides to locate the key species under the strict supervision of the WCS range

#### Seima Biodiversity Conservation Area (SBCA)

#### (Orange necked Partridge, Green Peafowl)

Keo Seima town, approximately 2 ½ hours from Kratie will be the base for birding in the evergreen forest of southern Mondulkiri. One of the largest remaining blocks of Southern Annamitic forest lies in this little explored corner of Cambodia, providing a chance to see birds not encountered elsewhere in the country. Species including those more commonly associated with Vietnam such as: Germain's Peacock-pheasant, Red-vented Barbet, Pale-headed Woodpecker, Bar-bellied and Bluerumped Pitta, Golden-crested Myna and Grey-faced Titbabbler.

All of these are possible whilst searching for the localized, globally endangered Orange-necked Partridge in it's favored habitat of bamboo forest.

#### OTHER BIRDWATCHNG DESTINATIONS

#### Kratie

#### (Mekong Wagtail)

North of Kratie the Mekong River flows through riverine forest and supports a rich array of nesting birds including several species of terns, waders, swallows, large water birds and individual species such as the Pied Kingfisher and Indian Skimmer. The Mekong Wagtail, Moctacilla samveasnea, honouring the Cambodian pioneer naturalist after whom the centre is named, is present in low numbers all along the river. The visit to Kratie always includes a boat trip to see the endangered Irrawaddy Dolphin.
